ON-SITE DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

Performing on-site drug test collections at your place of business or job site offers many benefits, including simplified logistics and the convenience of WSS coordinating the drug test collection process. Through our mobile, on-site collection service, we make it easier for you and your employees to provide urine, hair, oral fluid, or breath alcohol specimens for testing.

Here is what you need to know to plan your next on-site drug testing event:

MOBILE COLLECTION LOGISTICS

- Each WSS collector can complete 6–8 drug tests per hour. If breath alcohol tests are requested, as well, one collector will complete these simultaneously.
- Two collectors can share one bathroom to collect samples.
- A sink outside the bathroom made available for hand-washing will speed the collection process.

SCREENING BEST PRACTICES

- Proper tracking and auditing requires a list of all donors being tested. For random testing, WSS will provide the list, and for a sweep (all employees), your company provides the list.
- No employees scheduled for testing should leave the workplace while collection is underway. Any employee who wishes to leave should sign a document stating that their drug test is completed or refused.
- Schedule out each screening needed and do not inform employees of their time beforehand. Do not call employees as a group to be screened. This can give workers time and opportunity to drink water, get urine from another, or otherwise subvert the test.
- Even if an employee does not need to use the bathroom, send them for their scheduled screening anyway. Collectors do not require much urine, and often employees find that they can urinate even if they're concerned they cannot. If they cannot urinate, shy bladder protocols will be followed.

SHY BLADDER PROTOCOLS

Occasionally, some donors will not be able to provide a large enough urine sample or will not be able to urinate at all. Other donors may need a retest for a variety of reasons. In such cases, WSS institutes shy bladder protocols for these donors.

Once identified as a shy-bladder donor or a retest, each donor is monitored constantly. He or she may not leave the testing area and may not consume anything except water provided by WSS.

- Each donor is allowed up to 40 ounces of water for up to three hours. WSS will monitor water intake.
- Shy-bladder donors are not presumed or treated as guilty of anything.
- WSS has never administered a large screening with zero shy bladders.
- If shy-bladder donors need to go outside or leave the collections area, they must be accompanied by an approved escort.
